So she believed that everything I would need I will get them from Mary. I am orphan since one month when my mum died and during the 1994 genocide when I was 3 my father was killed. We were 9 in my family but we were left at 2, my sister and I. We lived in an orphanage center for 6 years. By chance the government took care of us, brought us to school and now I graduated last year from the National University of Rwanda, with distinction but I have no longer the governmental support. My country has a lot of great biodiversity. But people don't know or are not interested in conservation even though it is a main source of income through Tourism. I want to help my country to live in harmony with its beautiful biodiversity and also as a girl to change the view on how men in Africa see us.
